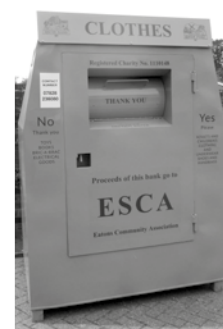

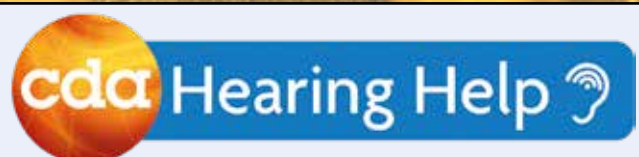
Old Ink Cartridges & Phones

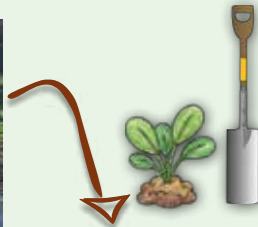

Last year I reported that we were going to develop a Bog Garden at the Pightle with the help of a Grant from the HDC "Biodiversity For All" project.



Our volunteers have worked extremely hard over the last eight months, and great progress has been made. After marking the design out on the ground, we spent a week digging out the whole area, laying down an impervious membrane with a thin gravel trap, then replacing all the soil.

The Bog is 125m long and covers 600m². We have planted up 10% with over 100 plants of 30 diverse types that are suitable for wet and boggy ground. We aim to finish planting the rest of the garden this year.

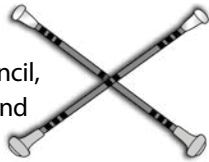

Bellringing

We have continued to ring from 10.00-10.30 for service at St Mary's most Sunday mornings and also manage to practice most Wednesday evenings from 7.45-9.00pm. We do have to rely on ringers from other towers to achieve this. We ring for weddings when requested. We rang the bells half muffled for Remembrance and we also rang half muffled on the sad occasion of the funeral the Rev'd Timothy Simon Robb who was our vicar from 2007-2026.

If you have the skill of church bell ringing you are likely to be welcomed at any church in the world with bells (most are in English speaking countries). It is possible to check on the internet when ringing is available. In fact one of our ringers recently visited Canada and was warmly welcomed by the Vancouver bell ringers.

Please let us know at the time of booking if you require assistance, use a wheelchair or scooter, or have an assistance dog. We recommend booking at least five days in advance, though we understand this isn't always possible.

Costs: 45p per mile (min £2) plus a £2 booking fee, payable to the driver.

choose their own availability and receive 45p per mile.

Administrators assist with bookings and provide a friendly voice for clients.
