In the end we squeezed as much out of our funds as we could, to give £3,580 in twenty-one grants, our largest number yet, to a wide range of causes – from Brownies and Guides, to Christmas meals for the isolated; from training community money advisers to looking after the environment of the Eatons, and notably giving a helping hand to some of our May Day entertainers who want to make sure

they are equipped and able to support youngsters who want to take part in future years. We're delighted to do our bit in getting the Eatons through tough times, and it's always a pleasure to hear at first hand about all the activities going on and how our grants are being put to good use.

# **Derek Giles: a tribute**



It is with immense sadness that we pass on the news of the death of long-standing ESCA committee member Derek Giles in November. A long-standing councillor at every level and twice Mayor of St Neots, Derek was also involved in a wide range of causes around the Eatons, starting with DOOM in the 1990s – the campaign to save the Ouse

Meadows from development – and many others over the years such as the Pightle and the Eaton Socon Charities. Derek was always involved in May Day, was a regular fixture behind the barbecue feeding hundreds of hungry visitors, and we were delighted to welcome him back both during his time as Mayor to welcome our May Queen, and also in 2022 to formally open the day. He would also mysteriously be "absent" whenever Father Christmas came to visit our carols on the Green and elsewhere...

Derek's energy and

enthusiasm for the Eatons and everything going on in them was boundless, and while he was involved in politics at high levels, ultimately becoming Chair of the County Council, for much of that time it was as an independent, specifically campaigning for the town that he loved in preference to toeing a party line. Derek and Sandie were awarded the Freedom of St Neots earlier this year, in recognition of two lifetimes of service to the community.



One of Derek's last missions was to ensure the land south of the Pightle be safeguarded as green open space and acquired for the community, and with that done, part of it will be planted up with fruit trees to become Giles's Orchard as a reminder of his contribution – as well as his love of cider apples.

# **Appeal from the Tower**

Since my article in the last edition of ESCAN, in which I appealed for new recruits to learn to ring Church bells, the situation has become more urgent. Since that article we have a new Monarch and an initiative, 'Ring for the King' has been launched. The aim is to teach enough people to ring every Church bell in the UK for the Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May 2023. Currently there are approximately 38,000 bells in the UK but only about 30,000 people to ring them. Therefore, we have our work cut out!

Bell ringing can be a fascinating and sociable hobby and once the basics have been mastered the learning opportunities and challenges are infinite. There are also endless opportunities for social occasions and a welcome awaits you in almost every church with bells in the country. Although our main job is to ring for Sunday services, you do not have to be a church goer to be a bell ringer. If you wish to know more or would like to see us 'in action' you are welcome to come up the tower to see what we do. For safety reasons please let us know beforehand.

As mentioned last month, Eaton Socon bell ringers are just about able to ring on a regular basis at the current time but would welcome new volunteers. We are hoping to recruit a few new people (from the age of 12 years) in the New Year in preparation for ringing for the Succession of King Charles III. # **Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch**

#### What is our purpose?

Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch Association (CNWA) works as a team, where everyone comes together to make their communities safer and improve the wellbeing of our residents. We work with the Police, Local Authorities and many other voluntary and professional organisations, but most importantly we work with residents. The Association is a not for profit organisation, non-party in politics, non-sectarian in religion, and we operate equal opportunities and non-discriminatory policies embracing the diversity in our communities.

#### What we do

We aim to help prevent crime and reduce the fear of crime. We do this by developing a greater understanding of how to prevent crime, and by



improving community vigilance and reporting suspicious incidents. We also aim to improve well-being in the community by encouraging activities aimed at improving neighbourliness, reducing loneliness and by fostering a community spirit.

#### What can you do?

We are always looking for unpaid volunteers to join us, at all levels of the organisation, particularly at local level.
