Donarbon Community Fund

If you are a not for profit organisation looking for grant funding for a capital project, you may be eligible to apply for a grant from the Donarbon Community Fund.

The Donarbon Community Fund, managed by the Cambridgeshire Community Foundation, receives landfill tax credits from Donarbon Waste Management and uses the money to make grants under set criteria.

The Donarbon Community Fund will fund projects in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough that are within 10 miles of a Landfill site.

Grants are available for the following projects -

- The provision, maintenance or improvement of a public park or other general public amenity
- The conservation of a specific species or a specific habitat where it naturally occurs
- The repair, maintenance or restoration of a place of worship or a place of architectural importance Grants will normally be for up to £20 000, although in exceptional circumstances, support to projects may be offered at a higher level. If you wish to apply for a grant you need to be able to contribute 10% of the value of the grant you are seeking.

The first stage to access a grant is to complete an expression of interest form. This form, along with guidance notes and more general information can be obtained from the Cambridgeshire Community Foundation (01223 421588) www.cambscf.org.uk. The panel who will meet to consider grant requests meets on a quarterly basis in early July, October, January and April.

Sue Jarrett - Paul Harris award



In recognition of her outstanding services to the community, the Rotary Club of St Neots St Marys has honoured Sue Jarrett with a Paul Harris award.

Named after the founder of Rotary International, the Paul Harris award is the highest honour that the movement can bestow.

Although in some clubs around the world members can receive the award by making (substantial) donations to the Rotary Foundation charity, St Neots St Marys, like most UK Rotary Clubs, awards it only in recognition of notable contributions to local communities or wider society. Moreover, the award is given a maximum of once a year, and some years it is not awarded at all, so it is a rare and highly valued honour.

Sue was nominated for the award by the 2007/8 Club President, Gareth Holsgrove and was unanimously approved by the Club in recognition of her excellent work for the local community, particularly through ESCA, her work on local history, her distinguished service as a greatly admired teacher at Crosshall School, and her service to the Guide movement. In receiving her award, Sue joins a small and distinguished group of local residents whose service has been recognised in this way.

Learn more about the Hobson family, a staunch church going family who once owned nearly all the property on the west side of the Great North Rd up to the Wheatsheaf and who built York Cottages to hide the Chapel. Learn also about Bedlow, a police sergeant in Biggleswade who bought up property in Eaton Socon and whose family owned them for over 100 years.

Pt 2 - Nelson Road (Bunny Lane) to Andersons Butchers. This area was the centre of the village and had the village shops such as general stores, drapers, sweet shops, butchers, blacksmiths, a taxi service and hairdressers. Find out about The Wheatsheaf, The Old Sun, Drakes Post Office, Cotton and Bamfords and the Telephone Exchange. Learn about the influence that William Law had during the nineteenth century, and about the vicars who lived in the new vicarage and enlarged their garden. Find out about Charles Dickens stay in Eaton Socon when he found the Cock Pub full one night and so slept in the house opposite.

All these booklets are available in the St Neots Reference Library and the County Archives offices in Bedford and Huntingdon.
