


Eaton's Young Tourists do club proud

The Bell Public House





LAWN CARE IN WINTER

Mowing

Don't be afraid to mow the lawn (if it needs it) even if it is December or January, as long as there is no frost on the around.

Fallen leaves

Leaves should be cleared away as they fall.

Soil compaction is a frequent cause of turf deterioration and moss invasion. For optimal effectiveness the lawn needs aerating in autumn.

Disease

There has been a lot of disease in lawns this year. We have seen Red Thread and Fusarium. You may have seen bleached patches which have red cotton like threads growing from the older leaves of grass. This disease can leave scars in the lawn and if weather remains mild they need to be treated.


Moss Control

Moss will build up in soils that are not free draining. If moss is left untreated the grass becomes thin Treat with iron sulphate based fertilisers or spray with a liquid iron treatment.

Worm Casts

This month will probably see the appearance of worm casts (small mounds of earth brought to the surface by worms). It is advisable to scatter the casts with a broom otherwise they encourage weeds to grow

Eatons Hidden Secrets

Thank you for all those villagers who told ESCA that Shakers Way does not go past Tythe Farm. Next time we will let you know exactly where it goes and why it is called Shakers Way or Sheakers Way. We have also been told that there is another unusual shaped farmhouse at Gransden.

This time we thought that you might like to have a more local hidden secret. Have you ever had a good look in the Old Sun Car Park in Eaton Socon?



There are obviously cars in the car park but if you have a good look at the back wall there is what looks like a fireplace and two columns with an archway over, which is often covered in ivy. The fireplace is part of a building that was once attached to the Old Sun Public House which had a brewery at the back and was still there on the 1925 Land Valuation map.

The two columns and archway in the wall were around a gate that once led to Eaton Socon Vicarage. Just south of the Sun Public House is a large house now called Glebe House but which was the Vicarage until the early 1930's. Servants and tradespeople were not allowed up the main driveway to the vicarage and would have to ask permission to go through the Sun yard and in through the back entrance which was through the back wall of the Sun yard. Why not go and have a look around the car park but be careful of the cars?

Sudbury Meadow and The Pightle

Have you found these two special areas in the Eatons. Sudbury Meadow in Eaton Ford is up Crosshall Rd just beyond the Barley Mow on the Riverside side of the road. Here visitors can find meadows, an orchard, examples of wildlife, bird and butterfly gardens and lots more. Notices explain what can be found and seating allows visitors to sit a while, watch and listen.



The Pightle is situated on the back footpath in Eaton Socon and can be found just behind Capulet Close, near the cricket field. If visiting by car it is a good idea to park near the church and take the footpath leading north from the back of the churchyard. This large field has been left in a natural state and is full of wildlife. Visitors are likely to hear many birdsongs, see rabbits and squirrels playing and a walk through the field will lead to a bench near the river where boats can be seen quietly cruising along.

Booklet News and Reviews

Due to the large amount of information on the Great North Rd two booklets were produced in May this year -

Pt 1 - Texaco Garage to Nelson Road or for the older residents - Howard and Wrights Mill to Bunny Lane. Find out about The White Horse, The Eagle, The Plough, Eaton Socon Brewery, Howard and Wrights Mill and Whiteheads Toy Factory. Learn more about the Hobson family, a staunch church going family who once owned nearly all the property on the west side of the Great North Rd up to the Wheatsheaf and who built York Cottages to hide the Chapel. Learn also about Bedlow, a police sergeant in Biggleswade who bought up property in Eaton Socon and whose family owned them for over 100 years.

Pt 2 - Nelson Road (Bunny Lane) to Andersons Butchers. This area was the centre of the village and had the village shops such as general stores, drapers, sweet shops, butchers, blacksmiths, a taxi service and hairdressers. Find out about The Wheatsheaf, The Old Sun, Drakes Post Office, Cotton and Bamfords and the Telephone Exchange. Learn about the influence that William Law had during the nineteenth century, and about the vicars who lived in the new vicarage and enlarged their garden. Find out about Charles Dickens stay in Eaton Socon when he found the Cock Pub full one night and so slept in the house opposite.

All these booklets are available for reference in the St Neots Library and the County Archives offices in Bedford and Huntingdon. **St Neots Museum now stock copies for sale.**
