Eaton's Hidden Secret - Bushmead Priory

Why not take the chance to visit
Bushmead Priory, which is in Eaton
Socon Parish. The Priory was
established in 1195 and while there is
very little left of St Neots Priory from
the Dissolution there is a substantial
building left at Bushmead. The
Augustinian Priory's medieval refectory,
original timber roof, wall paintings and
stained glass survive. The oldest and
most interesting feature is the
preserved timber crown post roof.



As part of the Heritage Open Days the Priory will be open on Saturday 12th September: 10 am – 4pm and admission will be free on that day. Prebooking is required so please phone Wrest Park on 01525 860152 if you wish to visit. It would be a great idea to share cars as the car parking space is limited. To find the Priory travel out of Eaton Socon on the Bushmead Rd a few miles until you find the small group of houses named Bushmead. At the crossroads turn right towards Little Staughton and after approx 100 yards is the entrance to Bushmead Priory.

St Neots Children's Centres

There are three Children's Centres in the St Neots area, based at Bushmead School, Winhills School and Little Paxton School. They all look and feel very different from each other, but all offer services to children 0 -5 and their families

Families are invited to go along and have a look at what is on offer, ranging from a free toy library loan service, to adult learning courses, to baby massage and cooking classes. Staff are available at all times, and can help with any questions and queries relating to parenting. They can give information on childcare, support to manage

behavioural issues or just offer a friendly ear if the day has been a real challenge! They are also able to link families in with other professionals if needed, for example, health professionals, Jobcentre Plus, Hunts Mind



Information on services is available from each centre, through Health Visitors and midwifes, and families are also welcome to telephone the centres Opening hours are from 8.45am – 4.30pm Monday to Thursday and until 1pm on a Friday.

They are also are able to sometimes assist with transport particularly if there are 4 or more cats. Cat carriers and cat traps can be loaned for a refundable deposit.




