The production is being staged by St Neots Christian Performing Arts in close collaboration with members of St Neots Players, Vamps and local schools. The production will consist of a series of scenes telling the Easter story. Each scene will be acted in a different part of the town centre, starting in Eaton Ford with the events of Palm Sunday, and concluding with the Resurrection of Christ in Riverside Park. 

THE GIRL GUIDES CENTENARY AND THE TREFOIL GUILD

The Guide Association celebrates its Centenary next year. There have been articles in newspapers and magazines, and a programme on television.

The publicity started to coincide with "launch parties" which were held on 5th & 6th of September all over the United Kingdom. This was to commemorate the day when a group of girls, calling themselves Girl Scouts, gate crashed Robert Baden-Powell's first Boy Scout Rally, at Crystal Palace, in September 1909. He

allowed them to stay and decided that something had to be done for the girls.

The Girl Guides began in 1910, at first with his sister Agnes in charge and 6000 girls joined immediately. Later the mantle was taken up by his wife Olave Baden-Powell. Today there are 10 million Guides worldwide and 575,000 in the United Kingdom. (With 50,000 waiting to join.)

St.Neots Division is a small part of this stretching from Kimbolton to Gamlingay taking in the Town and surrounding villages. Like everyone else we held our "launch party" on 5th September and we look forward to taking part in local, regional and national events throughout the year.

Trips to major attractions have been planned as well as more local visits, parties and camps.

A Centenary Camp is to be held at Harwood House when 30,000 are expected to attend.

Services will be held throughout the Country, including at Peterborough Cathedral and Westminster Abbey.

The finale will be on 20th October 2010 at 8.10pm, when everyone is to renew their promise.

As part of the celebrations the Trefoil Guild (the senior members of the Guiding movement) was given the challenge of getting a Flower Bed in every Town in 2010. As Secretary of St. Neots Trefoil Guild and in my other role as Division President, I have been in contact with Huntingdon District Council regarding having one in St Neots Riverside Park.

Souvenirs of the centenary will be available and the Guide Association has a Story Gathering project for the Archives. If you were once a member and would like to get involved by sharing your experiences, please contact me on 01480 212485.

ST NEOTS OPEN SPACE VOLUNTEER TEAM



FORTY SEVEN YEARS ON AND SCOUTING IN THE EATONS IS STRONGER THAN EVER

In 1962 Doug & Ena Baldock started the 1st Eaton Socon Scout Group to offer local lads the opportunity to experience the adventures that the scouting movement presented. Today the Scouting movement now include both Girls and Boys in all age groups:



-Beavers 6 to 8 yrs scouts -Cubs 8 to 10 Yrs -Scouts 10 to 14 Years -Explorers 14 to 18.

Over 60 youngsters meet weekly at the Scout Hut on Mill Hill Rd. The emphasis is fun and adventure based on scouting principles, members undertaking a wide range of new activities. The UK headquarters for Scouting have arranged national activity days for both Beavers and Cubs allowing our members to meet and take part in activities with other members from around the UK. The Beavers. Cubs and Scouts were able to go for a week long residential experience at the PGL site at Cathorpe, which included adventurous activities we are unable to participate in locally.

This year's St George's Day parade and service was hosted by St Mary's Church, Eaton Socon, where we were privileged to be supported by the A.T.C marching Band with members of the Scouting movement attending from Eaton Socon, St Neots and Kimbolton.

In October the Scouts joined forces with the Huntingdon Radio Club to take part in this year's Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) - an international event held the same weekend all over the world where Scouts can contact other Scouts using Short Wave Radios. We were able to contact the World Scout Headquarters in Geneva as well as scouts from Alaska, Australia, Russia, USA, New Zealand and groups in GB and Europe. The Mayor of St Neots, Gordon Thorpe, paid a visit and talked about his experiences as an RAF radio

As with all voluntary organisations we face numerous challenges, the greatest being recruitment of uniformed leaders. We have a dedicated group of leaders headed by Richard Carpenter, who give their time freely. Their reward is the enjoyment that the youngsters get from scouting.

We have an extensive waiting list for both Beavers & Cubs and if we can recruit more uniform leaders we can offer more youngsters the chance to enjoy the adventure that is scouting. 
