'Cultivating Pride in our Town'

We seem to have had a rather long, chilly and dull winter, so what a relief to see colour returning to the Eatons as bulbs, winter hanging baskets and Council bedding displays respond to the spring sunshine. Well done to everyone for brightening up our lives, particularly those of you who planted bulbs last autumn. St Neots in Bloom volunteers have been out with their cameras to record the changes, ready to include in our 2013 portfolio.

You may have been wondering what is to happen with last summer's wildflower bed on Eaton Ford Green. Whilst the display last year got off to a good start, we were disappointed that it rather faded during late summer. We know many people liked the mixed colours, but there was also a feeling that it didn't quite fit in with the more formal displays in the other flowerbeds. We are waiting to see whether the Town Council is going to plant it with annuals, a mixture of perennials and annuals or perhaps even return it to turf.

Now for something a little different. Do you grow alpine type sedums? Would you be able to donate a few cuttings to help us with an experiment please? Over the last few years, St Neots in Bloom has been promoting ways to help the declining bee population. Bees have become quite a hot topic recently, with the EU proposal that some neonicotinoid insecticides



should be banned. Our approach is less controversial! We would like to explore the possibility of increasing the mixture of low growing sedums in the closed churchyards around the town. Sedum acre grows naturally within the surrounds of graves in a number of the churchyards (see above) and provides welcome nectar for bees. We could make the display even more attractive by including additional species. Do let us know as soon as possible if you can help.

Well, what a winter! Nobody can have missed the scale of the flooding in December, with the water coming up beyond anything I have seen before – and sadly washing away some of our bark chip path, only laid the week before to provide a way through the already waterlogged ground. With snowfalls either side, it was certainly an inhospitable time. On our website you can see dramatic views of the floods – with our new bench standing forlornly surrounded by water – and beautiful snowscapes.

Our volunteers are not daunted by bad weather, though! Although all seems quiet, our grant from the AmeyCespa Landfill Fund has helped us get through a lot of work. Our kissing gate has been completely redesigned with a hard surface and wider access, so that people with mobility scooters can enjoy the Pightle. Look at the ground as you enter that way, and you'll see the plaque we were presented with as a Queen Elizabeth II Field In Trust – the first in the area to receive that award, as far as we know. Flood-damaged paths have been repaired, and we will be carrying on improving them through the year. And we are now waiting for the delivery of our new information boards, mapping out the Pightle's paths and showing the wide variety of flora and fauna you can find. We'll be using our new noticeboard to put up seasonal guides of what to look for as you walk round. A huge thank you is due to local artist Gill Holt for the lovely illustrations.

On a less welcome note, our volunteers also have to deal with problems such as the fences being deliberately damaged. While they're rightly proud of all their efforts, it's frustrating that time and precious funds are used up repairing vandalism. The Pightle belongs to the whole community – if you see anything suspicious please report it, as otherwise we all lose out.

By the time you read this, the first of the year's bulbs will be well on their way to flower – keep an eye out for bluebells, aconites, snowdrops, celandine and wild garlic, in addition to the unmistakable daffodils. Here's hoping for a really colourful display to welcome in the spring!

Problems with buses!

One round of changes to our bus services has recently happened, with the X5 now stopping at the George & Dragon, and the X4 becoming the 64. The St Neots Area Bus Users group is continuing to talk to the operators and monitor how they are getting on, with the aim of improving what we have. Coming soon is



the Cambridgeshire Future Transport project - a major consultation exercise in which the County Council will be looking for local communities to help design transport services for the next three years. In the Eatons this will affect existing services 75 and 150, and also perhaps to "fill in the gaps".

In addition to scheduled buses they will be considering prebooked minibuses, car sharing, and taxis, and it will be up to each community to come forward with ideas about the services they want to see. SNABUS will be taking part formally, based on what we've found out talking to people around the Eatons, but it is open for anyone to respond. The more who take part the better! Although the site has just been launched it already has 40 members, and 200 'likes' on the facebook page.

There is also advice for more serious 'stuff', such as bullying, health, and keeping safe online. Donna hopes in the future to take the site nationwide and emphasised that while it is great fun for the users it can also be a source of support. Headway UK

Living with a brain injury can have a whole host of effects, as it can be the result of different events – strokes, heart attacks, road accidents, falls, assaults, surgery and brain tumours. There can be physical and sensory effects – such as visual impairments, reduced mobility, and poor balance, and there can also be cognitive effects - such as poor memory, difficulties with planning and organising, making decisions and solving problems. These difficulties can all be barriers to getting involved in the community, preventing access to activities and impacting on the ability to live a full and healthy life. Headway UK work with people living with the effects of brain injury and their families. Some may be getting statutory support from social care, while others aren't eligible. In either case, Headway can help them to access other relevant services and find opportunities locally that they might be interested in, dependent on their interests. This helps to give some structure to the week and provides the opportunity to meet new people.





This scene shows Pecks Butchers when health and safety was not uppermost in peoples minds when they went shopping for meat - no sparkling clean stainless steel counters but meat hung outside the shop on hooks. The flies would be brushed off and the meat cut to order. On the plus side was the fact that the livestock was slaughtered on site so when you bought beef or pork you knew that it was definitely the right meat. Eaton Socon had more than one butchers shop and several bakers so villagers could get what they wanted without needing to walk into St Neots. There were also plenty of pubs for drinking and Eaton Socon held its own annual fairs on the village green.

So why not come along over the May Weekend, buy a book and reminisce over the past with the old photographs. If you are a newer resident then buy a book and see what life was like before the fields were covered with housing. If you are new to the area then come along and find out where Pecks Butchers once stood on the Great North Road and which shops are now in the building.
