Bigger changes have been afoot, though. We wanted to create more spaces for celebration trees, and in doing so have come up against the Pightle's history; the gravel pits on this site were filled in with fly-ash from the old Little Barford power station, and over the years it has hardened into solid lumps. With help from the Town Council we've dug holes and filled them with fresh soil suitable for planting trees in. The opportunity was also taken to level the ground somewhat, add more topsoil around the orchard area and seed with wild flower mixture to create more colour this summer. If you would like a tree planted to commemorate a loved one or a significant anniversary, please do get in touch. We're also very grateful to regular volunteer Mick Brazier for completely rebuilding our gate into the cow field, and we hope it will make a big difference to walkers who find the stile difficult to manage.



Keen eyes may have spotted some of our trees have acquired a personality of their own! We have some more faces coming this year, to entertain our young (and youngat-heart) visitors, and we hope you'll have an enjoyable time tracking them down. We're also delighted to see how many regular dog walkers make use of the Pightle - Ziggy, my german shepherd, is a great fan of being able to lark about off the lead in a safe environment – but please, dog owners, to make the Pightle as pleasant as possible for everyone, do come armed with bags and use the bin near the main entrance...

Home-Start offers support and friendship to families with young children. The families decide what kind of support they need - whether it's emotional support, coping with illness or disabilities or difficult life circumstances



What is the connection with Manitoba in Canada, Wagga Wagga in Australia and our rural parish of Eaton Socon? Surprisingly the answer lies in the families connected with public houses in Eaton Socon parish. It might be expected that in such a rural parish the publicans would be local people but several of our licensed premises in the last 200 years were run by outsiders and some of our villagers emigrated beyond England to set up home in the far flung countries of the Empire.

Visitors to our coaching inns on the Great North Road included famous names such as Charles Dickens, Samuel Pepys, Lord Montgomery, Lady Louis Mountbatten, football teams and their fans, sporting celebrities and members of the nobility. Horses could be cared for by the ostlers, the vetinerary surgeons and the local blacksmiths. When cars arrived there were garages with petrol pumps at or near some of the public houses. Eaton Socon was a thriving settlement for the traveller.

Today there are fewer licensed premises and there are no stables or vets but all the past and present public houses have a fascinating history. In the new book are some fascinating stories of the families. Find out about the tractors outside one pub, the death of one landlord who drank contaminated water, the beerhouse with a field for a tap room, the Eaton Socon Brewery, and much more. Discover who lived in Manitoba for 30 years as a Pioneer, who married in Wagga Wagga and lots of more. This new book is full of fascinating information about our past and present public houses.
