Usually in February I write about how the winter has left the Pightle rather bare, the rains have turned the paths to mud and we're just seeing the first signs of spring. One of those is certainly true as usual – there are some decidedly boggy patches around, so do take care when walking around. But a remarkably warm December and January by usual standards means that our daffodils have been in flower since Christmas week, along with the many others planted around the Eatons. Indeed, I'm wondering

if they will even last until Easter! It is certainly odd to see them ahead of the snowdrops, which are now appearing in large clumps in the wooded areas.

Our bulb planters will also be pleased to see this year's crop of miniature daffodils and white crocus appearing now. Some years the new bulbs get established much better than others, so we never quite know what's going to come up, but as the days get longer we should see more and more patches of colour appearing.

Over the winter our volunteers have been beavering away tidying up both the river bank and the meadow area at the top, removing elder, brambles and ivy where they have invaded around some of our trees. Ivy in particular is a problem as it can accelerate the decline of trees that are towards the end of their lifespan. This should keep ours healthier for years to come and make

them easier to tend to without fighting through mounds of prickles, as well as giving a much nicer view of the river itself. Don't worry, we're not purging out all the brambles so there should be plenty of blackberries in the autumn – we're just making sure they stick to where they should be! A big thank you to everyone has helped; even a little cutting back each week makes a huge difference over the course of the quiet season.

A blue plaque at the George and Dragon

On Sunday 7th February the 15th blue plaque was unveiled in the Eatons. Richard 'Tomo' Thompson, a regular in the George and Dragon Public House, unveiled the plaque which recognises the importance of this public house during many centuries. A pub has stood on this spot for well over 200 years and was at first called 'The George' and is believed to have had an inn sign with the sailing ship of that name. In the early 19th century the ownership changed and a new building was built with the north part as the inn and a front door onto the street. The southern part of the building was a market gardener's dwelling and the present car park area was the land on which produce was grown and sold. When the market gardener moved out in the 1970s the public house expanded, the main door into the public house became a window and the original market gardeners door became the door into the pub.

The George also gave its name to the nearby cottages and blacksmiths when the hamlet became known as George End, and for many years it was the end

of the village of Eaton Socon before crossing the stream and entering Maltmans Gardens and Eaton Ford, or going up the hill and heading northwards.


