It's the growing season and our wildlife is making the most of every opportunity, as a visit to Sudbury Meadow will show you. However, there are a few threats looming on the horizon and you may be able to play a small part in preventing one of them from devastating some of our native flora and most popular garden plants.

Have you heard of the bacterial pathogen Xylella fastidiosa? If you watched Channel 4's 'Food Unwrapped' on 12th February you will have seen how this deadly bacterium has devastated many olive groves in Italy's Puglia region. However, what was not reported is that the bacterium can affect many other plants too and has been discovered elsewhere in Europe, including Spain, France and a glasshouse in Germany. It has already caused huge damage in the Americas. Xylella fastidiosa infects the water-carrying cells (xylem) of a plant. It causes symptoms which are similar to other diseases and environmental causes, such as leaf scorch, wilt, die-back and plant death. It is spread by xylem-feeding insects such as froghoppers. Whilst these insects can't travel far, the bacterium can be transported via infected plants. Host plants include some of our hedgerow plants such as Sycamore, Cherry plum and Dog-rose as well as domestic plum (Prunus domestica) and garden favourites such as wallflower, lavender, hebe and rosemary. There is no cure.

You can help by trying to buy UK-grown plants. You can also check that imported known host plants (see link below) have been checked to make sure they do not carry Xylella (they should have a plant passport). It is also essential that you do not bring back any plant material collected whilst on holiday abroad. Apart from being illegal, you could unwittingly be introducing this bacterium to the UK!

# Highways problems – Blocked drains, potholes etc

Do you have a pothole or blocked drain in the road near you – if so then take a photo of the drain, pothole or fault and download the photo onto your computer then......

- 1) go to website www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk
- 2) click on **Report** on the right
- 3) click on **Roadworks and Faults**
- 4) scroll down to find the heading **Report a**pothole or other highways fault then click on
  the heading
- 5) Read the box that appears and click **Continue** at the bottom left corner
- 6) A map will appear **zoom in using the + button** in the bottom right corner
- When you see large red coloured blobs then click on the location of the fault and a red dot will appear on the map and a form on the left.
- 8) Fill in the form giving as much detail as possible
   for drains the 'Problem Type' will be 'Flooding'.
- 9) Finally **upload a photo**.
- 10) **An email** will be sent to you when you report the fault and when any action is undertaken.
- 11) Wait and watch for any action. It appears that you cannot report more than 10 faults so ask your neighbours to report some.

A walk around the Pightle one weekend with my camera was a good reminder of how tentative the first signs of spring are — while the ground under my feet was still frozen in patches, the sheltered areas have plenty of winter aconites and snowdrops — they are now spreading away from the places where they were first planted and clearly enjoy their situation! The daffodils are late this year, as those planted by ESCA on Nelson Road are a colourful display, but the Pightle's ones are some way from flowering. March is a month of rapid change and a time for regular visits — you'll see something different each time! My walk was also a reminder of how much effort is put into the Pightle by so





many friends, as it looks pristine all year round; a visit to Bunny Lane to snap the blossoming snowdrops there was a much sadder sight as they compete for space with piles of rubbish from passers-by.

The work dealing with ivy, elder and brambles that were engulfing some areas has progressed with a section near the riverbank being opened out and cleared of overgrowth since the last ESCAN. In addition to a better view of the river, the black poplars are now easier to find, and our bird boxes are in a much better position to be used in the year ahead. Managing the Pightle for the good of all the species that live there as well as people and other visitors is not always easy but we hope you'll enjoy the new space. If you'd like to help guide the future of the Pightle, please do get in touch – the existing Trustees will certainly welcome fresh faces!

Next year, in 2019, it is 50 years since the children were transferred to Longsands School in St Neots, after part of Eaton Socon Parish became Huntingdonshire. The building was then adapted and used for primary school children who moved here from the school in School Lane.

A school reunion is planned for July 2019 – date to be confirmed.




# **Fusion Youth Club**


