

Sudbury Meadow

Sudbury Meadow, in common with several wildlife sites in St. Neots, depends on the good will of volunteers to maintain the varied habitats. We have small groups who enjoy maintaining the three wildlife gardens, growing their own vegetables in some of them. Others enjoy more vigorous tasks such as digging or hedge cutting, getting valuable exercise at the same time. It isn't all work though and along with many visitors to this small Eaton Ford site, we all enjoy watching the wildlife too. It might be the friendly robins 'helping with the gardening,' or bees, bumblebees and butterflies which fascinate during spring, summer and even autumn with fair weather.

Winter is more subdued, but there are still things to look out for. The Guelder Rose berries can attract bullfinches, redwings, song thrushes and even, on rare occasions, waxwings from Scandinavia. The berries left by the birds are often eaten by small rodents such as bank voles and wood mice. Small piles of red skins can sometimes be seen next to their holes in the shrubbery.



Can I remind dog walkers who use Sudbury Meadow that it is an official HDC 'Dogs on Lead' site, so please do just that and preferably a short lead so you can see what your dog is up to. Not only does this make it more friendly for other users, but your dog is not disturbing wildlife by running all around the site and most importantly, you can see where it has pooed and collect it up (there is a waste bin by the Crosshall Road gate). A big 'Thank You' to all those who already collect up their dog's poo and often that of other people's dogs too. To those of you who don't want to, then please keep your dog out of Sudbury Meadow.

Our tree faces were very popular and had lots of you searching to find all of them; sadly some fell victim to vandals but they are back again, and if you keep your eyes peeled you may find they are spreading to other parts of the Eatons...

We've had some changes in the Trust that oversees the Pightle as well – a big thankyou to Kate Norden who has left us to move to much warmer climates, and a welcome to Jeannette Cadney and Mick Rose as new Trustees. If you'd like to get more involved with the running of the Pightle, we would love to hear from you – being a Trustee is not arduous work and fresh faces and new ideas are always appreciated!


