Last autumn we were very grateful to the British Legion, Scouts and Guides who all came down to help us plant a large area up with poppy seeds, to mark the centenary of World War 1. Sometimes plants take a while to get established, but not these - we've had the most glorious display this year of poppies, from deep reds through to subtle pinks. And of course they attract bees from all around; I could easily spend an afternoon watching our industrious friends making the most of a superb crop! The flowers are finishing just as I write, but they are strong seeders so watch out for them again next May.

I'm a great fan of making elderberry jam, something you don't see in the shops and which has a unique taste — it's supposed to be good for warding off colds. The apples are a little sour to eat raw, but they do cook well.

We always welcome helpers when there are jobs to be done —planting, mending fences, cutting back overgrowth and dead wood, all help to keep the Pightle pleasant and welcoming. We are now joining up with St Neots TimeBank to encourage more people to get involved; give us an hour of your time and earn an hour's credit to use with a range of other volunteers. We hope it'll be a good way to get more people involved with the Pightle and keep alive some traditional skills. See you on the 24th October for bulb planting, if not before!





### Windmill's 200th Birthday

No birthday telegram for the Duloe Windmill but we can all wish it a happy 200th birthday! A plaque at the windmill notes that the present mill 'was built for Wm Arnold in 1815 on the site of an old postmill burnt down, the charr'd beams of it are to be seen in this MILL, next owner Jos Arnold had it 20 years'. Wm Arnold also had a house built facing the Great



North Road, and three cottages alongside Duloe Road. The windmill is now a private house, the land on which the millers cottage once stood is now the site of 3 houses on the Great North Road and the three old cottages have been made into a barn. If you have never found the windmill - then stand in the Co-op car park in Eaton Ford and look around. It can be seen just to the north of the entrance.


