Autumn at Sudbury Meadow - apples ready to be picked, hedgerow and shrub berries ripening, hazel nuts being stored by grey squirrels, leaves turning lovely colours and late season butterflies still on the wing. If we are really lucky, some mild weather so we can sit and enjoy the wildlife!

Autumn is also a busy time for our volunteers as we try to maximise the benefit of the various habitats for our local wildlife. For example, hedgerows aspire to be rows of trees! So it's important to keep them cut to provide good nesting habitat for a number of bird species. However, it is an offence under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to knowingly disturb nesting birds or destroy their nests. As most hedgerow nesting birds can be active between 1st March and 31st



August, it means we have to wait until the autumn before we hedge-trim (or be very careful!). The shape of the hedgerow is quite important too. In a garden we are all familiar with the straight sided hedge and flat top. This isn't the best shape for a hedge however, as it tends to create bare patches towards the base where less light reaches it. It is better for the hedge and wildlife if its base is a bit wider than the top. At Sudbury Meadow we try to leave long vegetation at the base of some of the hedges for most of the year, as you would traditionally see along countryside lanes. This gives insects and small mammals places to breed and hide.

Not visited Sudbury Meadow yet? It's easy to find. From the roundabout by Riverside Park, turn into Crosshall Road, go past The Barley Mow and Sudbury Meadow is on the right, just before Regatta Meadow. The pedestrian gate is not locked! Just lift the latch on the inside of the gate to open it. If you would like to come and help us this autumn (corporate groups also welcome), or join the Friends of Sudbury Meadow, then please get in touch (see below).

The Pightle Millennium Green -Eaton Socon







One of the pleasures of wandering round the Pightle is looking for all the various plantings we've made over the years and seeing how many are thriving – in particular all the colourful flowers. Our large patch of poppies, planted by the British Legion, Scouts and Guides in 2014, has produced a lovely display, and the buddleia next to the butterfly bench is doing its job attracting butterflies with its bright flower heads. More buddleia, which can survive the weakest of soils, will be coming soon to fill in gaps along the north fence where hawthorn has found it hard to grow. The sheer number of bees, butterflies and bugs is a good indication that things are looking healthy.

Autumn will soon be upon us and that means plenty of fruit — particularly apples, blackberries, elderberries and sloes — which you are more than welcome to help yourselves to (though do make sure you know what is safe to eat). We'd love to hear from you if you make anything with our produce. I'm a great fan of making elderberry jam, something you don't see in the shops and which has a unique taste — it's supposed to be good for warding off colds. The apples are a little sour to eat raw, but they do cook well.

We always welcome helpers when there are jobs to be done — planting, mending fences, cutting back overgrowth and preventing, all help to keep the Pightle pleasant and welcoming. We have joined up with St Neots TimeBank to encourage more people to get involved; give us an hour of your time and earn an hour's credit to use with a range of other volunteers. We hope it'll be a good way to get more people involved with the Pightle and keep alive some traditional skills. See you for bulb planting, if not before!



Grave on the move!!

Have you spotted the grave with metal barriers around it in the churchyard? This is an important grave of the first known headmaster of the Eaton Socon Academy, a private school that flourished in the 19th century.

By 1829 John Elliott was the headmaster and when his first wife and baby son died in 1837 they were buried in the churchyard within sight of the school. A year later John married Phoebe Underwood and the family grew. When John died in 1871 he was buried with his first wife and sons, and when Phoebe died in 1900 she was brought back to be buried in the family grave.

By 2015 the grave was badly overgrown, the monument was tilting badly and trees had grown within and through the railings. A decision was taken to restore the grave with the help of the Town Council and some amazing volunteers who have very kindly spent many hours removing the trees and restoring the grave to what we see today, which even included moving the monument! The next stage is to get some new railings around this important grave.

The Eaton Socon Academy was a private school in the large white house facing the churchyard with road access from Peppercorn Lane. It boarded boys mainly from the ages of 12-16 and the subjects taught included Latin and Greek, Plain and Ornamental Penmanship, Algebra, Geometry, Merchants Accounts, the use of Globes and Land Surveying. Fees for boarders in the 1860s were 20 Guineas (£21) for boys under 12 yrs and £25 Guineas (£26.25) for boys over 12 yrs. The school closed in 1900 and more recently villagers recall the glove factory in the building in the 1940s – early 1970s.




