Photographs are beginning to appear of pupils and teachers and information is being checked, but we would like more. Can you help us with more photographs and names?



Thanks to a team of Bushmead pupils who won the competition the winners were able to paint the bollards with paint supplied by ESCA.

Future investment or just encouraging apples?

Part of the ongoing management of the Pightle is to encourage commemorative trees in the west of the Pightle (the bit near the large wooden seat).

Trustees have always encouraged residents to plant fruit trees in this 'orchard 'area. Over the years pear, cherry and plum trees have been planted. However, it has always been the dream of the present chairman of Trustees to grow and form a cider apple orchard. (Could this be that chairman Derek is a CAMRA member of long standing?)

So when a kind supporter of The Pightle donated a whopping £250 for community trees, the donator did not need a lot of persuading to share Derek's vision of eventually being able to produce our very own Eatons Cider. With the help of St Neots Town Council who helped prepare the soil by removing some fly ash and replacing it with proper soil we now have 14 young cider apple trees to complement our three other apple trees. Old varieties of apples with the names of Foxwhelp, Gilly, Dabinett, Red Streak, Michelin, Katy, Russett and the ever popular Kingston Black are now putting down roots in our Pightle.

It will take a few years of tending and nurturing to get these trees established before the first pressings take place. However, there are many apple trees here in gardens in The Eatons so perhaps we should consider organising an 'Apple Day'. Hiring a press and having a funday for all. Anyone interested?

Local members of the Royal British Legion at the WW1 Commemorations in Belgium

Members of the Eaton Socon branch of The Royal British Legion joined thousands on a pilgrimage of Remembrance to WW1 battlefields culminating in a parade and ceremony in Ypres as part of the end of the First World War centenary commemorations.

The Royal British Legion event, known as Great Pilgrimage 90 (GP90), took place between the 5th and 9th of August and was one of the largest in the charity's history. GP90 marked 90 years since the original Royal British Legion Pilgrimage in 1928, which saw 11,000 WW1 veterans and war widows visit the battlefields of the Somme in France and Ypres in Belgium, a decade after the conflict ended. The 1928 Pilgrimage culminated in a march through Ypres to the Commonwealth War Grave Commission's Menin Gate Memorial for a ceremony to commemorate the launch of The Hundred Days Offensive and in remembrance of those who never returned.

Local Legion members, Michelle Allison and Hazel Allison represented the Eaton Socon Branch and the local community at the event. They toured some of the same battlefields and cemeteries visited by those on the 1928 Pilgrimage, before marching along the original route to the Menin Gate on the 8th August, Michelle bearing the branch standard and Hazel laying a wreath on behalf of the Eaton Socon and St Neots community.

They joined more than 2,200 other Legion representatives and dignitaries, including Civic and military guests from the UK, Commonwealth and Northern Europe. Albert Hayes of the Eaton Socon Branch of The Royal British Legion, commented: "Great Pilgrimage 90 is a unique opportunity for the Legion community to come together and bear our Standards along the same route in Ypres taken 90 years earlier by the veterans and widows of WW1."
